REQUIRED RESOURCES:

This Reading Guide is based on the textbook *Horizons: Canada's Emerging Identity*, 2nd edition, written by M. Cranny, G. Moles et al and published by Pearson Education Canada. (ISBN 0-13-504046-9).

INTENDED USERS:

The Reading Guide was designed for use by teachers of Canadian history and social studies courses. It can be used in a variety of settings, for example:

- in conventional classrooms as **guided reading assignments** for the *Horizons: Canada's Emerging Identity* textbook in preparation for teacher designed activities;
- in any classroom as “**make up**” assignments for students who experience extended absences;
- in **multi-grade classrooms** where teachers must present several different social studies courses;
- in classrooms where students enter and exit a program at varied times and require **self-paced study materials**.

CONTENTS

The Reading Guide includes the following components:

- a *reading guide* and *answer key* for each section of each chapter in both MS-Word and .pdf formats, and
- a *chapter quiz* and *answer key* for each chapter in both MS-Word and .pdf formats.

EVALUATION

Each reading guide is accompanied by an answer key for the teacher's use.

There is also a quiz for each chapter. The quizzes consist of the *key terms* listed at the start of each chapter and the *focus questions* found at the start of each section of the textbook. Because the format of each quiz is constant, students can easily prepare in advance and be

expected to generate well thought out answers. The answer key provides the definitions for each quiz's key terms. The answers for the focus questions are left up to individual teachers. One possible approach for evaluating responses to the focus questions is to assign 1 mark for each appropriate point made in answering the question.
