

Crossword Puzzles for Counterpoints: Exploring Canadian Issues

Notes to Teacher

This package of crossword puzzles contains the following components:

1. Three crosswords for each chapter of **Counterpoints: Exploring Canadian Issues** - a total of 54 crossword puzzles.
2. Answer keys for each puzzle.

Clues for multi-word puzzle answers are preceded by a notation that the answer consists of more than one word. For instance: “(5 words)” at the start of a clue indicates that the answer will be that many words or initials. For example, *North American Free Trade Agreement* could become either *NAFTA* or *NorthAmericanFreeTradeAgreement*. Similarly, *David Suzuki* becomes *davidsuzuki* and is treated as two words. All provinces are treated as a single word (e.g. *BritishColumbia* is one word as is *BC*).

The crossword puzzles in this collection can be used in a variety of ways. They can help focus your students as they read a chapter from **Counterpoints: Exploring Canadian Issues**. They can also serve as a quick review of a chapter’s content at the end of a unit. The puzzles also compliment Better Classroom Guidebooks’ Learning Guide for **Counterpoints**.

Three different versions of each puzzle is provided. This will allow students to work in groups and still have different puzzles. The puzzles are essentially self checking – if the student’s answer fits, it is generally correct. When I mark the puzzles I usually scan them for completion and spot check some of the answers for clues that have given students trouble.

I have found that many students who claim to dislike social studies will often enjoy completing social studies-based crossword puzzles. Students who “do little work” in class will often spend time processing their textbook seeking the answers to the puzzles. In many cases, even reluctant students will start to absorb information and begin to be interested in “finding out more” about our country’s history and geography! I believe that you will find the collection of ***Crossword Puzzles for Counterpoints: Exploring Canadian Issues*** to be an entertaining and motivating way to boost your students’ learning.

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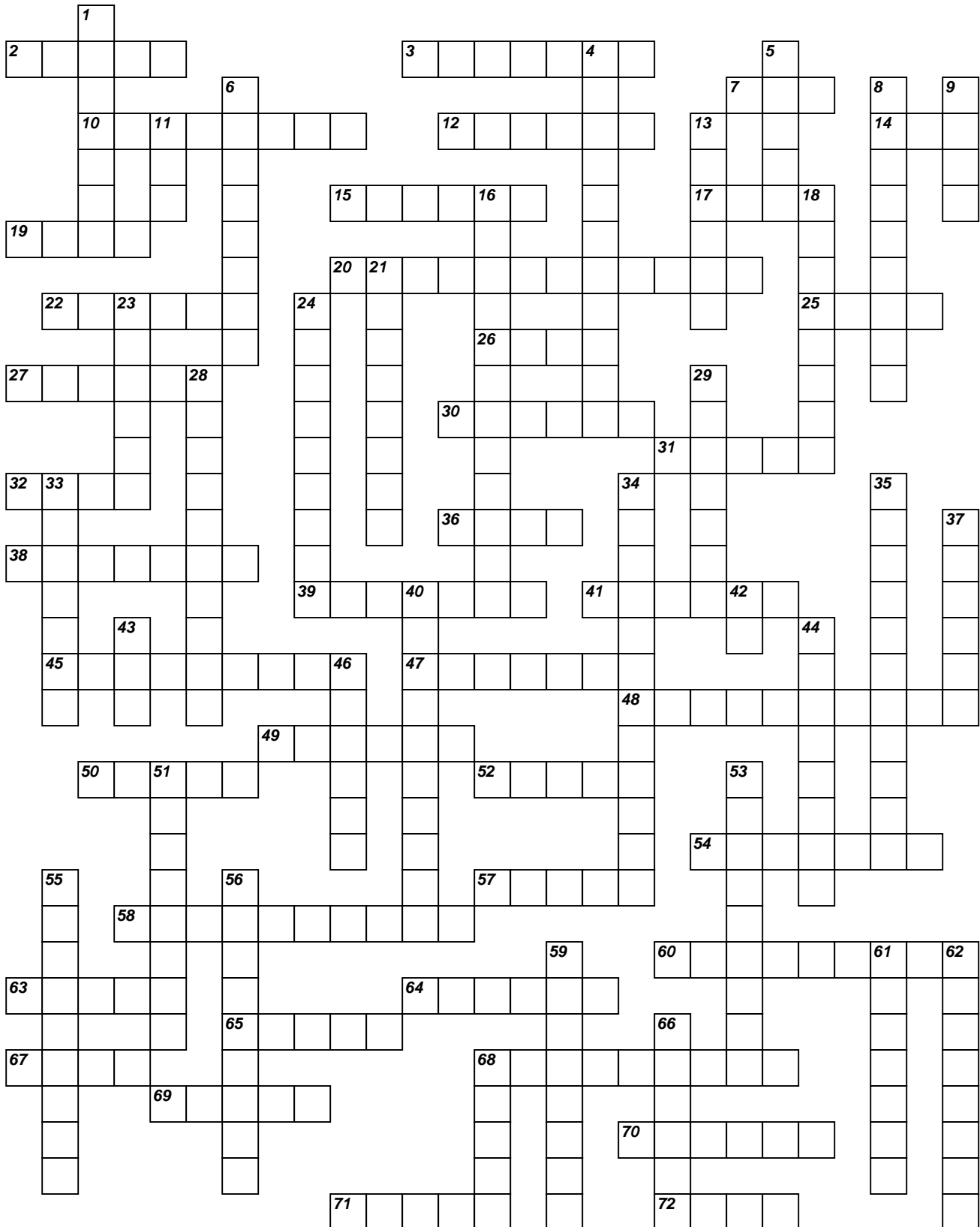

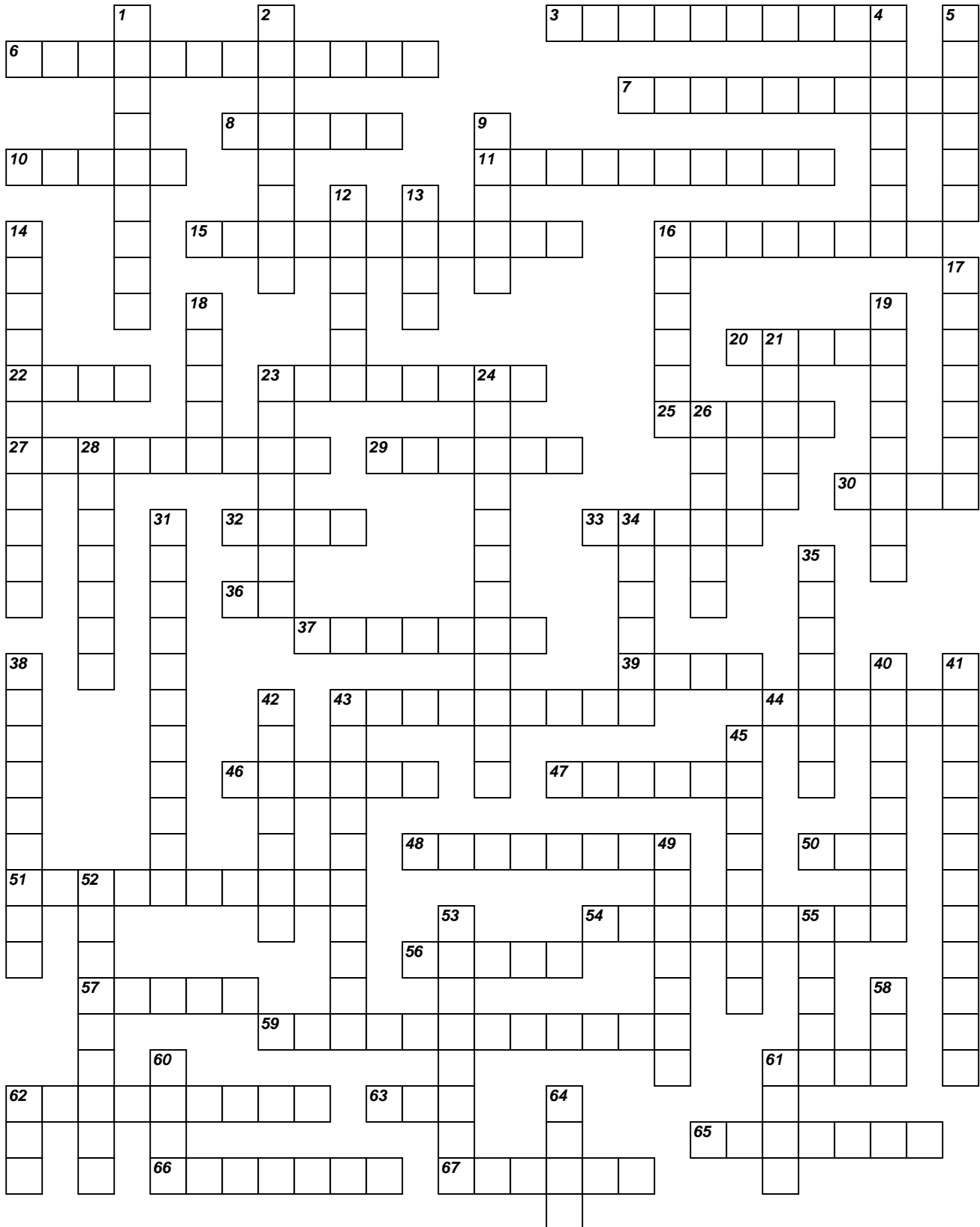

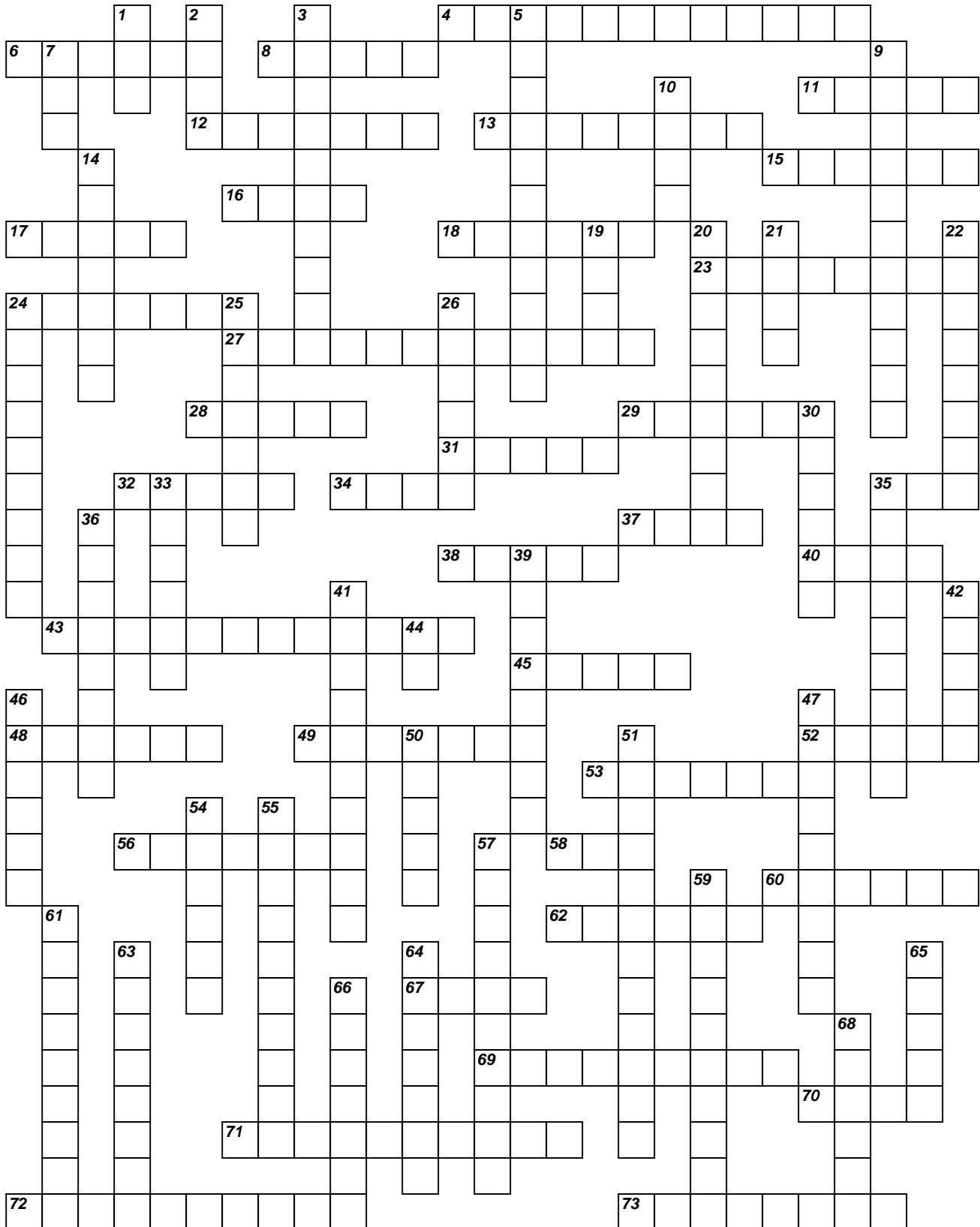
